
Who gives my address?

The E9-1-1 coordinator for your town gives this address based on distance from an intersection of a road. This person is appointed each year via your select board and the position lies often with the town clerk or zoning administrator. (*There may be a fee* with your town to generate a new address for you, depending on their ordinances)

- Has all of our data such as addresses, roads, hydrants as well as VCGI and VTrans layers like parcels, lakes & rivers, telephone pole locations and many more.
- Updated on a weekly basis.
- Overlain on various satellite imagery.

Should I post my Address and/or Unit Number and Where?

Yes! Post your address and/or unit number so that it is visible in a blizzard or the thick smoke of a fire. Thus it's recommended to get reflective numbers and post them at roughly eye height, and are at least 2-3" wide. Post at the beginning of your driveway and on your door for maximum visibility and to lower potential confusion. You want to be found in an in event of an emergency! (*Reflective* green address signs are available via purchase at most town offices) Why is my address being readdressed when the house hasn't moved? Most likely reasons that do not follow state law are below:

- 1. There are now 3 houses on a shared driveway and now needs new numbers and a road name.
- 2. Your number is significantly off in distance.
- 3. Your number is off in distance, but within reason, but is out of order with your neighbors address.
- 4. Your number is an even number on the odd side of the road or vis versa.
- 5. Your address is the same as a nearby structure. (*each building gets its own unique address number*)
- 6. Your address has a driveway access off a different road.

Why Can't I get an Address Number for my Lot?

Towns need a staked driveway location to measure to in order to give you a number. (If you change the location of your driveway, you address is subject to change)

Why Can't I get Phone Utility Service Yet?

Your address may not be in the 9-1-1 mapping system yet. Verify with your town that this information has been sent to the state to add or you can check on our viewer to make sure it's correct.

If my 9-1-1 Address Changes, does this Change my Mailing Address too?

Yes! Your 9-1-1 address is your physical address, where responders will access your house in an emergency. The only exception of not changing mailing is if you have a P.O. Box in another location. Your 9-1-1 address may have another town name if it is accessed in that town, even though your house may not physically be within it.

Why Proper 9-1-1 Addressing is Important for Your Safety?

It limits the potential for confusion to locate you or your property! Most towns are based on a 1/1000 mile scale, thus your address of 628 means you are located .628 miles on the right side of the road from the closest major road intersection.

Why is my new address wrong on Google or my car GPS? Why can't I get mail at my house now?

While receiving an address change, the VT9-1-1 system only takes a week or two to update, bigger companies oftentimes take much longer to get these updates. They can be manually updated by submitting requests to Google, Bing, Tom Tom, Garmin, ect. to speed up the process of getting packages or to be found easier. It would be wise to verify with your post office that they received notification of your address change from the town office.
