July 2024 Flooding

On July 30, 2024, a storm that no one expected dumped nearly 8 inches of rain on Brighton. In addition to washing away roads and culverts – already compromised by heavy rainfall just two weeks earlier – members of our community suffered extensive damage to homes and property.

Thank you to those folks who reported their damage to 211. This is critical in helping Vermont secure a federal disaster declaration – which gets us a step closer to obtaining recovery funding. The next step is to apply for FEMA assistance ASAP.

Ongoing & Upcoming Town Projects

The Town of Brighton has several important projects in the works. Each is intended to enhance the quality of life in our beautiful community, as well as safety, efficiency, reliability, and resiliency.

Municipal Energy Resilience Program (MERP)

\$500,000 grants are available through MERP for projects related to weatherization, thermal efficiency, and supplementing or replacing fossil fuel-based heating systems with more efficient options. We have worked with auditors to assess the needs of each town-owned building, and now we're just waiting for the State to open the grant application so we can submit.

Wastewater and Drinking Water Facilities: Repairs & Upgrades

The Wastewater Treatment Facility is past its useful life. We must upgrade to comply with state regulations and to maintain safe operation. One pressing issue is the removal of excess sludge, which can lead to serious safety and environmental hazards. We are in the process of acquiring bids for this part of the project.

The Drinking Water Treatment Facility also needs significant upgrades at the North and South plants, as well as at the reservoir.

We are actively working with H20 Innovations to procure contractors for reservoir repair and continuing efforts to secure grant funding for this important work.

Did you know that you can pay for municipal services - like water and sewer - online? For many, this is a faster, easier, more convenient option.


