MERP

Got MERP? We do!

The Municipal Energy Resilience Program (MERP) helps municipalities throughout Vermont complete projects related to weatherization, thermal efficiency, and supplementing or replacing fossil fuel-based heating systems with more efficient (and less expensive) options. Brighton won the grant and will receive about \$500,000 within the next month. We'll nail down plans throughout the winter and get to work on some important (money-saving) projects in our town-owned buildings come spring.

Planning Commission: Public Hearing

Earlier this fall, a petition was brought to the Planning Commission/Development Review Board, asking the question, "Shall the Town Repeal the Brighton Zoning Bylaw." On November 18, 2024, the Planning Commission held a public hearing, giving voters the chance to learn about the issue and voice their opinions. Thank you to all who attended, participated, and viewed the hearing online.

So, where are we? The Planning Board will compile a report, incorporating community feedback, and bring it to the Selectboard, along with their recommendations. After that, the

Selectboard will warn another public hearing. This is a long, involved (and yes, tedious!) process, but all the i's need to be dotted and t's crossed.

How does zoning, or a lack thereof, impact our community? One example: Island Pond is a designated "village center." This gives us priority when applying for grants. A requirement of this designation is that we have zoning. No zoning, no designation, and, quite possibly, no state and federal monies to complete critical projects (e.g. repairs/updates to the wastewater treatment and
